\* In these counties, some areas (census tracts) are urban and some are rural. Since discounts are entered on the Form 471 Worksheet B by individual library or outlet, some libraries or branches in the same county could have different discounts. However, in Marion County and Collier County, the urban/rural issue does not affect the discounts because at 80 percent there is no difference between urban and rural discounts.
